A look at how our 2024 achievements align with our strategic plan.

- Ensure sustainability across financials, human resources and operations.
- Welcomed 9 new doctors and 6 new staff
- 2024 was a record-breaking year for REACH Niagara fundraising, nearly doubling our previous high set in 2023.
- Secured \$3,000,000 in funding over three years from Health Canada's Substance Use and Addictions Program for the launch of the new JSTICE program.
- Strengthen governance, accountability and transparency at the Board & Executive levels.
- Organization welcomed 2 new board members.
- To strengthen our Board Governance, we collaborated with Niagara Community Foundation's Governance Program
- Achieve effective, streamlined and enhanced service delivery that continues to meet the needs of our community.
- Remarkable SUAP (Substance Use and Addictions Programming) results. See bottom of page 3 for more information.

- Opened 6 new clinics (more on page 7)
- Transitioned the Gillian's Place clinic from a mobile setup to a permanent indoor location to enhance client safety and privacy.
- The Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) Clinic has completed 123 packages, thanks to collaboration with the Niagara Region, Portage and Niagara Medical Family Health Teams, Niagara Community Legal Clinic, and the St. Catharines Library.*



ODSP clinic has had a remarkable 50% success rate for our applicants.


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- Enhance engagement with our healthcare providers and staff.

REACH's Impact

Growing to meet demand

In 2024, REACH Niagara served over 6,000 clients across 22 locations in 7 municipalities—clear evidence of the growing need for accessible, community-based healthcare. This surge in demand underscores the effectiveness of our model and the trust we've built within the communities we serve. Still, limited capacity means some individuals go without the care they need.





On November 22, 2024, REACH Niagara was honoured to celebrate the official opening of our new shared office space, created in partnership with Start Me Up Niagara. This exciting milestone marked the launch of REACH Niagara's first official office. A significant step forward in our journey to better serve the community. The newly renovated, 3,500-square-foot facility is now home to REACH Niagara and also supports the expanded operations of Start Me Up Niagara.

More than just a physical space, this office represents a collaborative hub where our staff, community partners, and clients can come together. It is a central location for delivering essential services, while also fostering stronger connections and coordinated care. We are proud to share this space with Start Me Up Niagara, a long-standing and trusted organization that continues to be a cornerstone in supporting those in need across our community.



Dedicated Space

Our new shared space at 211 Church Street features a brand-new clinic designed for both primary care and counselling services. This dedicated area allows our staff to meet with clients in a private, consistent setting, supporting enhanced continuity of care.

Among our now 22 locations, 6 were added in 2024 including:


